TWIN PEAKS

GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE

People say walking across the Golden Gate Bridge is something you have to do at least once in your life. I don't know if you should trust those people! In all honesty, it's pretty terrifying. PAINTED LADIES

The "Painted Ladies of San Francisco" or "Postcard Row" consists of several colorful Victorian houses, located at 710 to 720 Steiner Street across from Alamo Square. You might recognize the houses from the popular TV show, "Full House."

CHINATOWN

Chinatown centered at Grant Avenue/ Stockton Street is the oldest of the city's four notable Chinatowns and an underrated gem of San Francisco. Yes, it's known for its good food and unique shopping, but this neighborhood is a cultural adventure that you cannot miss. Visit Chinatown Alleys, Golden Gate Bakery (cash only) and Li Po Cocktail Lounge (get the Chinese Mai Tai) while you're there.

SWEET MAPLE

This local breakfast and brunch spot located in the Lower Pacific Heights neighborhood is amazing. Sweet Maple serves classic American breakfast fare in a relaxing and cozy atmosphere. Their signature food? Brown-sugar glazed "millionaire's bacon," which I highly recommend.

PHILZ COFFEE

Philz serves the best coffee in the Bay Area. Their slogan is "A cup of love" and that's exactly how I would describe it. This coffee will make you think twice about why you're not moving to San Francisco! Get the Mint Mojito iced coffee and enjoy.





Spicy-Sweet SALMON STEAKS

2 boneless wild caught salmon steaks

1 teaspoon Cajun seasoning

1 teaspoon brown sugar

1 teaspoon vegetable oil

2 teaspoons lime juice

¼ teaspoon cayenne pepper

1 tablespoon peach jam (homemade preferred)

Salt & pepper to taste

DIRECTIONS

Combine the Cajun seasoning, brown sugar, cayenne, salt and pepper. Rub mixture over both sides of the salmon.

Heat oil in a cast iron skillet over medium-high heat. When oil is hot, it will ripple. Add salmon. It should sizzle and visibly shrink. Cook until seared. Salmon will release from the pan (about 4 minutes on each side).

Blend the peach jam with lime juice. Add to the hot pan allowing jam to melt. Baste salmon. Serve.

Sometimes the best solutions to life's challenges are suspended. No, I don't mean you have to wait for them—I mean they come from above. For instance, think of the famous Golden Gate Bridge and how it overcomes gravity by supporting nearly two miles of concrete and steel with cables anchored at the tops of two huge towers. A genius

engineering design that handles six lanes of traffic in one of America's busiest cities might not apply to home improvement projects, but the general principle of "suspension" surely does.

Here is one creative way to increase interior space with a gravity-defying approach.

Two areas of the home tend to get cluttered quickly: the kitchen pantry and the basement workshop. Whether it's too many spices, herbs and snacks; or random nuts, bolts and tacks, both of these places are seemingly always in disarray because of limited shelf space. If you don't have magically expanding shelves, it may be time to find a new storage system that doesn't rely on support from below.

For an innovative, eye-pleasing solution to space restrictions, you can make a simple "lid board." Never heard of it? That's because I just made up the name. (Maybe I should trademark it!) Anyway, a lid board consists of screw-top lids glued to a wooden board. Sound

simple? It is! When the board is secured to an overhead surface or wall with the open lids facing downward, storing your containers is a matter of simply screwing them back into their lids and letting them hang.

Many dried spices come in containers with small screw lids, so they make ideal candidates for lid boards. Sure, a simple spice rack is a space-saving solution, but it still takes up lots of space. Instead, glue the container lids directly to the underside of one of the higher shelves in the pantry so you can store your spices in mid-air! To make cooking a breeze, take it a step further and label the spice jars. Now, see, reach, unscrew!

You can use the same technique for your basement or garage workshop. To store nails, screws, bolts, tacks, nuts and other small hardware that accumulates, a lid board is perfect. Use mediumsize, glass preserve jars. But remember, screw lids only!

Install your new shelves at the foot of the bathtub for easy access and a streamlined new focal point. Toss out old, patterned towels and restock with plush, white bath towels to give your bathroom that 5-star resort feel.

Estimated Project Time:

30 minutes

MIRRORS TO ENVY

Let there be light, style and understated elegance. Mirrors are effortless additions to bathrooms that are less-



than-luxe. Not only do they reflect light, they make the space look bigger and open up the room. Add a little Parisian flair with a golden arched vanity mirror. More of a minimalist? Opt for an over-sized frameless mirror to reflect light without the flash.

Estimated Project Time:

15 minutes per mirror

WASHABLE WALL COVERINGS

An accent wall can make a huge statement, especially in the smallest room in the house. And yes, wall coverings are perfectly suited for the bathroom. Select a water-resistant, washable wall covering and you're in business. Wall-papering is fine as a DIY project, but there's also no harm in hiring a professional for flawless results. Either way, it's a cost-effective, weekend project with a huge return. No matter your taste, wall coverings can add a little whimsy or a little drama to a space. It's art for your walls.

Estimated Project Time:

2-3 hours for a small room

PEDESTAL SINK FOR SMALL SPACES

Updating a half-bath? A pedestal sink is ideal. It adds elegance without overtaking the space. It lends itself to an open and airy feel. Aesthetics aside, a pedestal sink is a quick upgrade that won't blow your budget. It's a DIY project for

the plumbing-savvy, but if you're not that handy, leave it to the pros.

Estimated Project Time:

Half-day from start to finish.

Add a heap of personality to the bathroom with custom tile-work in the shower or around the bathtub. The number of options might feel inundating: subway, glass, mosaic, two-toned — where do you begin? Your bathroom wall is your canvas. Make it your own. One day from start to finish

CHANGE OUT THE FINISHING TOUCHES

If minor renovations are too much to ask, try a decorating overhaul. Rethink your aesthetic and swap outdated chachkies for brand new accessories. Spruce up the space with a little greenery — bamboo is great in a bathroom. Wooden accessories add an earthy spa-feel. Round off a nature-inspired theme with a white coral sculpture.

Convert Spent Candle Jars into *Ouseful Art* by: Jane Monzures







Scented candles are wonderful to have in your home to add a whiff of a delicate scent to the bathroom, bedroom or a mudroom. Usually, they come packaged in decorative glass perfect for admiring and showcasing. But what's a girl to do when the candle is spent?! Get out your glue and your favorite decorative paper, because I have some ideas for you!

You can up-cycle those jars into vases for small plants, use them to organize your craft supplies, toiletries and office supplies or reuse them as tea lights. But first, "Ya gotta get the wax out."

HERE'S HOW

When the candle is wasted and the remaining bottom wax is dry and cooled, put the entire candle in your freezer. Let it sit overnight, then use a spoon or dull knife to push on the fro-

zen wax and pop it right out. Afterwards, wash the jar with warm soapy water to remove the wax residue.

DECORATING IDEA #1

If the jar has dark glass, add silver paint to give it a modern feel. You can paint it free hand but to create stripes use painter's tape and section half-inch increments with tape around the outside of the jar. Once the tape is secure, use acrylic paint and apply it all over the jar. Leave it to dry. Then peel away the tape to reveal perfectly symmetrical stripes. Use it as a pencil holder next to your desktop or a toothbrush holder on your vanity.

DECORATING IDEA #2

If your candle jar has clear glass, give it some permanent color using tissue paper, decoupage and a paintbrush. Make sure the glass is dry. Measure the height and circumference of the glass and cut tissue paper to fit. Cut the tissue paper into four quarters. Next, brush the clear decoupage on the inside of the glass and place the tissue paper on top of it inside the jar. Repeat with the four quarters to fit all the away around the inside the jar. Once it's dry, fill it with whatever you want. This look is great for a battery operated tea light or for extra storage in the bathroom for makeup brushes.

Don't be afraid to try new paint colors, paper textures or ribbons. This is your art. It's all up to you. Best of all, you can perfect your style and give them to friends as personal gifts from the heart.
